Recording Castlefield's historic transport infrastructure

In the final of our 'build-up' events Norman Redhead and Dr Mike Nevell will present on Castlefield's historic transport infrastructure. The evening will include three presentations on: the Bridgewater Canal; the Ordsall Chord new railway bridge; and planning and recording the historic environment in Castlefield.

Dr Michael Nevell is Head of Archaeology at the Centre for Applied Archaeology, University of Salford. He is editor of the international journal 'Industrial Archaeology Review', co-author of the Council for British Archaeology's Handbook of Industrial Archaeology, published in 2012, and Vice-Chair of the Association for Industrial Archaeology. He is the current Chair of the CIfA Buildings Archaeology Group.

Norman Redhead is the Director of the Greater Manchester Archaeology Advisory Service at the Centre for Applied Archaeology, University of Salford. He has over 30 years' experience of advising on and curating Greater Manchester's archaeology on behalf of the ten Greater Manchester authorities including Manchester City Council.

Chris Wild, Specialist historic building recorder and Project Manager at Salford Archaeology, will be giving the talk on Ordsall Chord.
